The Review Hearing in this matter, as provided for by Idaho Bar Commission Rule 509(d)(4), shall be conducted on **Monday, November 17, 2025, at 10:00 a.m. Mountain Standard Time**, based on the parties' availability as communicated to the Clerk of the Professional Conduct Board.

Idaho Bar Commission Rule 509(d)(4) establishes the following regarding the review process:

All hearings shall be by telephone, unless the Hearing Committee [Hearing Officer] prescribes another method. The Hearing Committee [Hearing Officer] shall review the existing record prior to holding a hearing, if one is requested. If a hearing is held, the parties shall be permitted to file briefs and make oral argument related to the grievance under review, and the Hearing Committee [Hearing Officer] may ask questions regarding the record before it. The Hearing Committee chair [Hearing Officer] may limit the

presentation at the hearing, in his or her sole discretion. All written materials related to the hearing shall be sent to the Clerk, who shall disseminate them to all parties and to the Hearing Committee [Hearing Officer].

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. Additional written documentation to support or refute the original grievance from which Petitioner seeks review may be submitted by either party, to be received by the Clerk of the Professional Conduct Board no later than October 27, 2025. Such written submissions must be limited to allegations being reviewed and no new allegations of ethical violations will be considered.

2. Because the parties have been granted ample opportunity to submit their claims and responses in writing, in the discretion of this Hearing Officer no additional written materials or submissions may be presented at the Review Hearing.

3. Each party may file one brief with the Clerk of the Professional Conduct Board, to be received no later than November 3, 2025.

4. Briefs are limited to fifteen (15) pages, double-spaced, and shall only address matters already in the record.

5. Failure to comply with the deadlines for briefs and additional written submissions shall result in the content of the late-submitted briefs and/or written materials not being considered. The Hearing Officer will then render a decision based on the existing record and any arguments presented at the Review Hearing.

6. During the Review Hearing, Grievant/Petitioner's initial oral argument and Attorney/Respondent's oral response, if any, shall be limited to no longer than twenty (20) minutes each. Attorney/Respondent may waive a response. In that event, there will be no time allotted for rebuttal. If Attorney/Respondent presents a response, Grievant/Petitioner shall be allowed a rebuttal period of no longer than ten (10) minutes. Attorney/Respondent may then elect to present surrebuttal, also limited to no longer than ten (10) minutes.

If either party fails to appear at the Review Hearing as scheduled, a decision may be issued based on the existing record.
